## INTRODUCTION

Kisan Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Shivaji Mahavidyalya, Udgir Dist.Latur is located in rural area representing a backward region of Maharashtra. Several law graduates and freedom fighters after the Hyderabad liberation movement thought that this region is socially, economically and educationally under developed. Urdu was the medium of instruction in this region which posed a problem for those who were familiar with Marathi. The language practiced was a challenge before the sons of this soil. To fulfill the academic aspiration and to cater the needs of people of this area and to bring education to the doorsteps became the cause and dream of the honorable members to register and educational society "Kisan Shikshan Prasarak Mandal" in 1949. The institute has taken up all efforts to achieve its motto "Bahujan Hitaya Bahujan Sukhaya". Welfare of the masses for the well being of the masses.

With these efforts K.S.P.Mandal initially started a Kisan Boarding (Kisan Hostel). Now the institute disseminates education through 20 sister institute from primary level to Ph.D. level. Shivaji Mahavidyalay was established in the year 1968. It is a grant-in-aid institute and affiliated to the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded. It is recognized by the UGC under its section 2(f). The college offers total 18 programmes out of which 6 in UG, 6 in PG and 6 in Ph.D. The college has arts, science commerce and Computer Science faculties with 22 departments. The institution has 30 permanent, 30 temporary teachers. The total strength of non-teaching staff is 65. The total strength of students is 1168. Out of these students 26 from other states, 22 students have enrolled for Ph.D. degree of which 4 students have been awarded Ph.D. The management of the college strives to propagate quality education for the stakeholders. The college has progressed qualitatively by producing number of eminent alumni successful on all walks of life

In the last five decades with its sincere efforts, college has emerged as a renowned college of Marathwada region and performing important role in educational, social and cultural development. Presently college has 1168 students on the roll out of which girl students is 503 for education. Our college office and library is fully computerizes. The college was accredited by NAAC peer team on January 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> 2004 and was accredited with B <sup>++</sup> grade.

#### PART-A

#### Plan of Action:

The plan of action towards quality enhancement for the academic year 2010-11 checked out considering the valuable suggestion of the IQAC of the college.

#### 01). Healthcare centre

**Action plan**: The plan of action was worked out by the college to strengthen and equip the health care centre.

<u>Outcome:</u> Efforts were taken by the college to strengthen and equip health care centre with all first aid facilities. Qualified honorary doctors visit regularly. Considering the strength of girl students, a qualified lady doctor visits the college health care centre.

Outcome: As it was decided by the college to help the poor students, Earn and Learn scheme is implemented. They are paid Rs. 15=00 per hour for at least two to four hour work. They are given the work in office, library, laboratories and on the fields to take care of the plants on playgrounds and botanical garden. Their spot payment record is maintained. In the year 2010-2011. 30 students have been given benefit of this scheme.

#### 03). Laboratory improvement

**Outcome:** Every year the college provides funds to equip the laboratories. For this sophisticated instruments, apparatus and chemical are made available. An amount of Rs. 76361 had been spared for the improvement. This amount is fully utilized to improve and equip the laboratories.
