Central Library is well equipped with ICT. SOUL software is used for library management. N-list (INFLIBNET) database is subscribed for library users so they can access their study and research. Up gradation of the library System is continue under different kind of Grants & schemes. Internet facility is available for students & staff separately. Reading rooms for Boys & Girls & Staff as available separately.

Ladies room is available for girl students. Separate rooms for NCC, NSS & Sports departments are available. Gymnasium is available for college students and staff
